



The Rockefeller Foundation's Covid-19 Vaccine Access and Confidence Survey Conducted by HIT Strategies Topline Survey Results

METHODOLOGY

HIT Strategies conducted the survey on behalf of The Rockefeller Foundation between January 29, 2021 through February 4, 2021. A total of 2,517 non-white BIPOC adults (18 years of age or older) responded: 503 from Baltimore, MD; 500 from Chicago, IL; 505 from Houston, TX; 503 from Oakland, CA; and 506 from Newark, NJ. 77 percent responded by landline or cell and 23 percent responded online. The length of the interview was 13 minutes.

INTRODUCTION

We are conducting a survey to help us better understand how people in our community feel about Covid-19 vaccination. Your participation is voluntary but important to the success of this research and the efforts of local community-based organizations working on this issue. All of your answers are confidential and will be combined with the answers from everyone who answers the survey. This survey will take approximately 13-minutes to complete.
