

How to Choose a Facilitator

Selecting the right fit facilitator for your convening is critical to achieving its purpose. Yet, there's no one size fits all approach. The most common facilitator models we encounter are:

- 1. Inviting a **subject matter expert** (often the convening organizer or a close partner) to take on the additional role of facilitator, or
- 2. Hiring an external professional facilitator.

We recommend selecting a facilitator (or multiple facilitators) based on the unique needs of your participants and the dynamics of the convening.
